| HB 5120 | SB 585 | Alternative Energy Sources—Authorizes MPSC certification for solar, wind and storage facilities of 100 MW or more for zoning exemptions. |
| HB 5121 | SB 588 | Land Use—Makes zoning enabling act subject to certification of solar, wind and storage facilities of 100 MW or more. |
| HB 5122 | SB 586 | Alternative Energy Sources—Authorizes MPSC certification for solar and storage facilities of 50 or more MW but less than 100 MW for zoning exemptions. |
| HB 5123 | SB 587 | Land Use—Makes zoning enabling act subject to certification of solar and storage facilities of 50 or more MW but less than 100 MW. |

Eliminates local approval for siting and permitting



Creates one-size-fits-all approach on land use



Negates existing municipal ordinances



Eliminates voice of citizens / right of voter referendum

No limitation on the overall area of land utilized in a municipality

No provisions on enforcement

No provision on fire protection / emergency response approval

No community host agreement for additional infrastructure / public safety

Allows applicant to make minor changes after site plan approved

Allows use of noncontiguous parcels to meet megawatt threshold

Allows site plan requirements subject to rulemaking authority

Allows decommissioning plan to be phased in with only 25% initially
